SRCD Statement on the Earthquake in Turkey and Syria

Our hearts are with all people who have lost loved ones and are trying to recover from the recent earthquake in Turkey and Syria. The United Nations estimates that nearly seven million youth have been impacted by the earthquake and its aftershocks. Many have been killed, injured, or orphaned.

Natural disasters present a significant threat to the health and well-being of children and adolescents. Actions are needed now to mitigate this threat. Greater investments in infrastructure, remediation efforts, and more effective, evidence-based responses will help promote healthy development among youth exposed to natural disasters and their families.
