Interested in developing an Early Childhood Policy (ECP) program at your university? This webinar will introduce participants to the Early Childhood Policy in Institutions of Higher Education (ECPIHE) initiative. Led by the National Center for Children & Families at Columbia University, the ECPIHE aims to prepare students for leadership and policymaking roles in Early Childhood Policy and establish a new field of inquiry in Early Childhood Policy.

As part of this work, the initiative has created open access materials that provide a "blueprint" for creating new ECP undergraduate and graduate degree programs and certificates, as well as technical assistance supports.

ECPIHE guides its work with an intentional eye towards equity and diversity; it seeks to engage diverse professionals and students, and equip future ECP leaders with knowledge about, and respect for, the diverse families that early childhood policies serve.
