## The Student and Early Career Council (SECC): Engaging the Future Generation

SRCD's Student and Early Career Council (SECC) is dedicated to increasing the involvement of students and early career professionals in the governance and decision-making of the organization.

The Student and Early Career Council appoints a voting member to each of the standing committees including the Governing Council, lending their voices and unique perspectives on the value of current initiatives and helping to shape future directions of the Society. SECC representatives also participate in planning the invited program for the Biennial and the largely early-career focused Zigler Policy preconference. The Zigler Policy Preconference, held the day before the Biennial, is an opportunity for developmental science researchers to connect with policymakers, and practitioners.

The current SECC is chaired by Guadalupe Espinoza (Professor, Child and Adolescent Studies Department, California State University Fullerton) and Natalia Palacios (Associate Professor, Educational Psychology and Applied Developmental Sciences Program, Curry School of Education, University of Virginia). ## The SECC offers:

- **Dissertation Research Funding Awards** to recognize dissertation projects that show strong potential to contribute to the field of child development. Ten winners are awarded \$2,000 each to help fund their dissertation projects. Recipients are recognized at the Biennial. The new call for applications will come in February. Follow SRCD on Twitter and Facebook for additional announcements about this opportunity.
- **Coffee Hours at the Biennial:** At the 2017 Biennial Meeting, SECC sponsored a hospitality suite where students and early career scholars enjoyed refreshments and networked with SRCD members. SECC committee members hosted 15 coffee hours on topics ranging from strategies for pursuing academic jobs to how to discuss topics of equity and justice in the classroom.
