<p>Example 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Strong research evidence supports the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) child tax credit as a mechanism for reducing child poverty	<p>Example 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Child poverty fell to record low levels in 2021• The degree of child poverty reduction varied by factors such as individual states' costs of living
<p>Example 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Strong research findings point to the need to address the teacher shortage in the State of California	<p>Example 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The supply of new teachers in California is at a 12-year low• Enrollment in educator preparation programs dropped by more than 70 percent over the last decade and has fallen below the number of estimated hires by school districts around the state
